MacBook and ArcGIS

- Unfortunately, MacOS does not support many different engineering software as Windows is the industry standard
- The only option for installing Windows on Mac is to use one of the below options, based on the CPU that your MacBook has
- To find your chipset: On your Mac, click the Apple icon in the top-left corner of the menu bar > select the “About This Mac” option

Parallels App (M1 Chips and Above)

- Apple stopped supporting Bootcamp for M1 chips. The only option as of writing is the Parallels App
